



Alex Rondorf West Bend West Class of 2018



Throughout her athletic career at West Bend West, Alex Rondorf displayed her athletic ability in five different sports, excelling in each whether she played them for four years or one year.

Alex, a 2018 graduate, played basketball for four years, softball for two years, soccer and cross country for one year each, and baseball—boys baseball—for two years.

Alex was a star for the West Spartans girls basketball team. She scored a total of 1,191 points over four years, holding the all-time leading scoring record for some time. She was first team all conference all four years, a captain of the team for three years, and averaged 17 points per game and 8.2 rebounds in her senior season.

She played on the West baseball team for two seasons, and lettered in softball, soccer, and cross country. In her junior year of softball, she was first team all conference and honorable mention for the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel All Area Team. In just one year as the goaltender for the West soccer team, she earned honorable mention all conference.

Continuing her basketball career at Michigan Tech University, Alex scored a total of 1,012 points, was a three-time conference honoree, and holds the record for the best free throw shooting percentage—96.5 percent. She then played for a season at University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh and was part of the NCAA Division III Final Four team. Alex earned multiple academic awards at both schools and completed three degrees.
