Charity Week at East and West High Schools Raises More Than \$65,000

West Bend — Charitable organizations, high school students, and local business representatives gathered on February 29 at West Bend East and West High Schools to celebrate another successful Charity Week (February 12-17) at the schools.

Charity Week is held each February by the student council. The council chooses at least six nonprofit organizations to receive donations from students and staff. The goal of the student council is to ensure students learn about at least 24 different charities during their time at East or West. They also find businesses, civic clubs, and high school clubs and co-curriculars to also provide donations. For 2024, the total amount raised was \$65,250—shattering the record set last year.

Highlights of Charity Week include representatives of each charity giving students and staff an overview of their organization during announcements. Students also enjoy dress-up days. The final event is a dance paid for by the student council with all ticket sales going to the chosen charity. Students from Kewaskum High Schools are also invited to the dance.
